

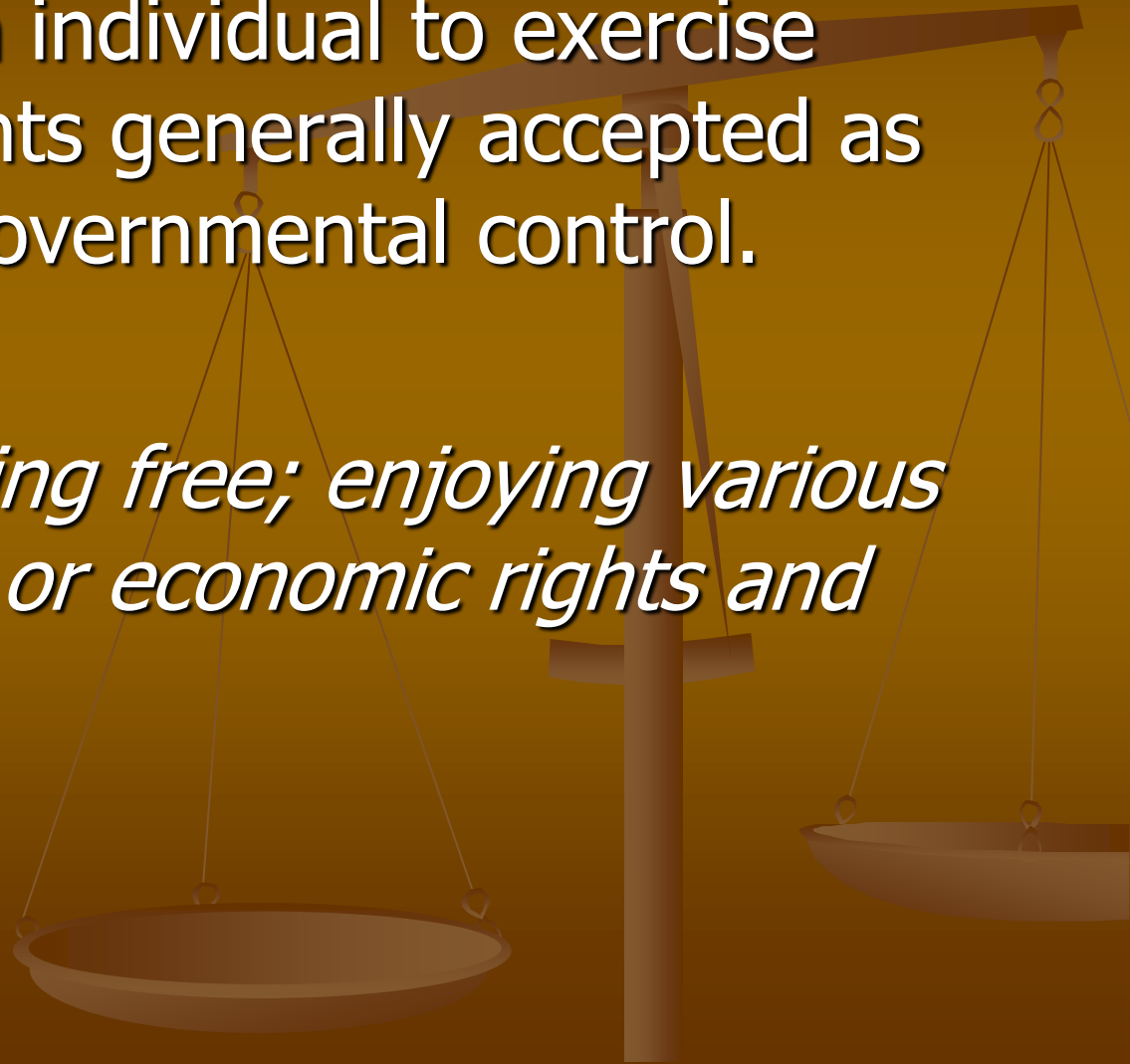

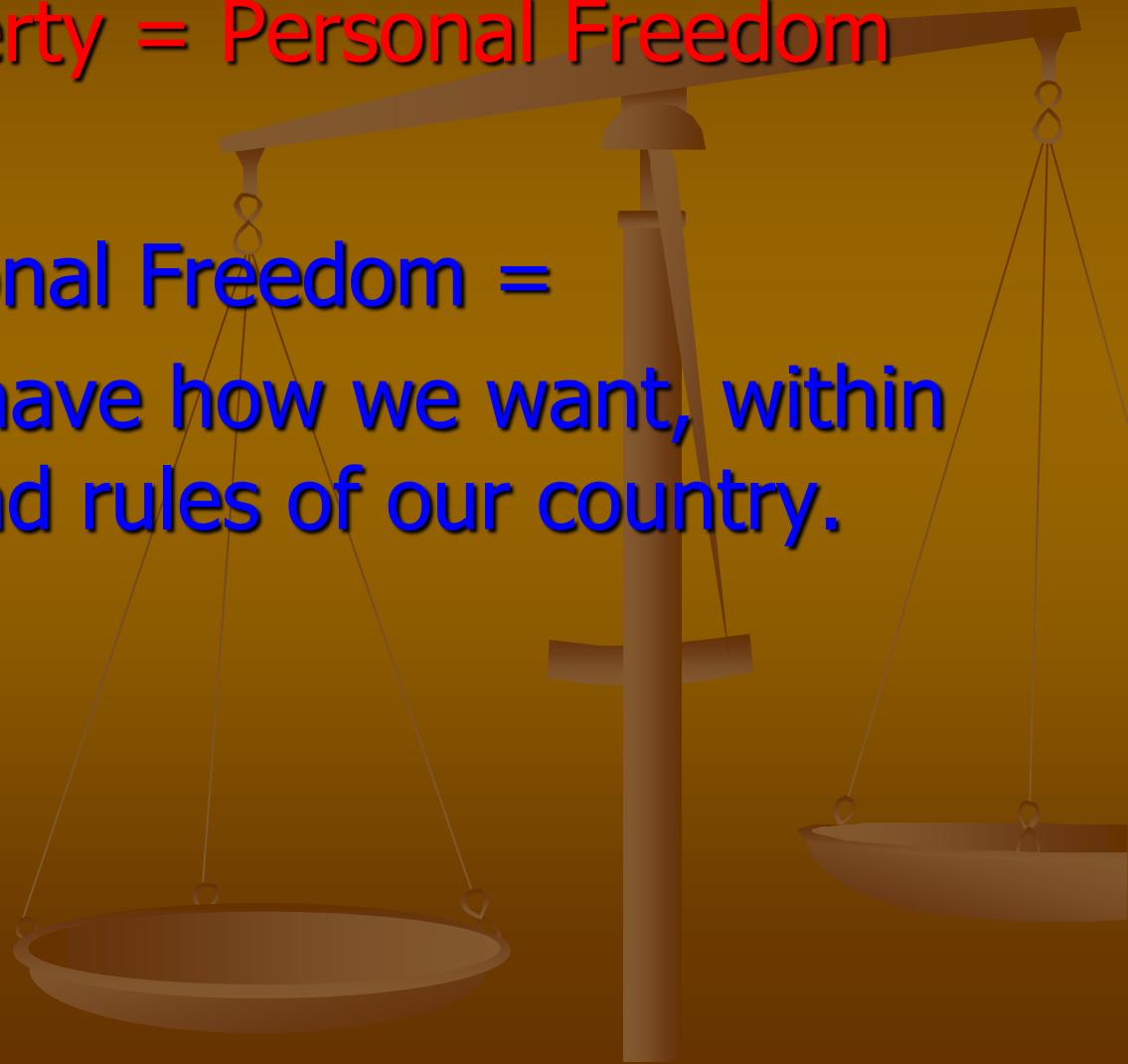


Try this:
