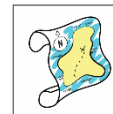


What is the journey of a rain drop?

Key Vocabulary

Country - a nation with its own government.	Location - a particular place or position.
Island - a piece of land surrounded by water.	River - a large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea.
Civilisation - organised group of humans in their own culture.	Urban - an area in or around a city or town.
Rural - an area in the country side.	Hamlet - a small settlement.
Village - an area of living that is bigger than a hamlet.	Town - a built up area with a name, boundaries and local government.
City - a large town.	Port - a place where ships load and unload, and its nearby town or city.
Harbour - a sheltered area of water where boats can be anchored.	Tributary - a river or stream flowing into a larger river.
Stream - a small, narrow river.	Precipitation - water falling to the ground in the form of rain, snow, sleet or hail.
Temperature - the degree or intensity of heat.	Weather - the conditions outside at a particular place and time.
