









# Year 5 Parent Learning Overview: Enquiry - Term 5

<b>Enquiry: What makes Earth, Earth?</b>		<b>Being a writer</b>	<b>Being a linguist:</b>
	<p>In this enquiry, the children will be engaged from the very beginning with a visit from the Space Dome. Thereafter the children will continue to explore an understanding of all things Space and present this work to parents in the form of an exhibition. This will be in the form of verbal, written and artistic pieces. This also explores Global Goal 15 which considers the conditions which allows 'Life on Land'</p>	<p>The children will write using their knowledge of Space and the Solar System writing a Non-Chronological piece about planets. The children will use relative clauses, bullet points and dashes. These may form part of the children's exhibition pieces for their Enquiry.</p>	<p>Children will continue to work as Theologians, recognising how the Values taught by Jesus and shared with us in the Bible can help us lead our own lives in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. The children will also have opportunity to review places of worship. They will revise their understanding of different places for a range of religions and explore the difference between them and why this might be.</p>
<p><b>Being a Scientist:</b> Linked to this enquiry, the children will be being scientists by exploring what the different types of force are and what impact they have on us. They will be using eggs and parachutes to explore gravity, using paper aeroplanes to explore air resistance as well as many other investigations to explore the different forces acting upon us.</p>			 <b>Theologian</b>
<b>Enquiry: Missing Mayans: What happened to the ancient civilisation?</b>		<b>Being a musician:</b>	
<p>In their final enquiry before the end of Year 5, the children will explore the Mayan civilisation learning about the Ancient civilisation and the legacies they left behind. The children will also use artistic skills to create their own artwork based on Mexican masks and the concept of the 'Day of the Dead'</p>		<p>This term the children will be focused on listening and appraising music. Each week, classes will be given opportunity to listen to different pieces from different genres, exploring instruments and perspectives.</p>

<p>Throughout Term 6, the children will be revisiting multiple key skills in preparation for their end of year assessments. The term will begin with a continuation of Fractions, recognising their equivalence before linking Decimals and Percentages.</p> <p>The children will then learn about geometry, statistics and time. Some of the Statistics objectives will be delivered through enquiry lessons and scientific investigations.</p>	<p>Throughout this term, Year 5 will begin reading the text 'Wonder'. Reading sessions are based around fluency, extended and close activities. Each of these has a differing focus, allowing the children to continue developing fluency whilst also exploring key questions based on themes, settings and characters. This text will be continued into Year 6 so the children will have opportunity to start exploring key themes. Children will also show their understanding of discrete texts in their end of unit assessments.</p>		<p>The children will continue to develop basic language skills with Mrs Hayes, our specialist French teacher, demonstrating these in paired and small group activities.</p>

<p>This term the children will use Scratch and develop their use of commands considering the selection of commands using words such as 'if', 'else', 'when'.</p>	<p>In Term 6, we are applying striking skills to play rounders. This builds from previous cricket lessons where we will be applying the same skills to a different sport. As Sports Day is in Term 6, the children will also practice throwing, jumping and running techniques in outdoor athletics. As the end of the years comes closer, there will also be opportunity for some team/group games using different skills from varying sports.</p>	<p>The children will use key individuals to produce their own mixed media pieces using a range of resources and techniques. This will include the use of collage and sketching.</p>
