


Year 6 Learning Overview: Term 4

SATs revision:	Being a Writer: Harry Potter	GPS revision:
<p>Most of this term will be spent learning the final skills covered in Year 6, as well as lots of revision of everything we've taught so far.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The tests will take place on the week commencing Tuesday 9th May 2023. These will take place throughout the whole week. During SATs week, children will be encouraged to be in school by 8:20 so that they can enjoy a breakfast cereal bar and juice with their friends in a calm and relaxed environment. As often as possible, children will complete each test in their usual classrooms. They will be taking: 3 maths papers (two reasoning and one arithmetic), 1 reading paper, 1 grammar and punctuation test and 1 spelling test. Children will be given a raw score (marks out of the total test) and will be told whether they 'meet the standard' or not. This information will come out at the end of the year, with their final school report. 	<div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Our second exciting text in Year 6 is the first in the most well-known children's fiction series ever - Harry Potter, by J.K. Rowling. Year 6 will use this text to explore a range of grammatical features such as different forms of speech, passive voice, cohesion within a text as well as punctuation to clarify meaning (such as brackets, colons and dashes).</p> <p>We will then use these skills to explore other genres such as instructions, newspaper reports and Brochure writing.</p>	<p>In term 4 we will continue to practise the Year 5/6 spelling list in order to prepare the children for the test - please find copies of these in their SATs packs. We will continue to practise particular spelling patterns (i.e. prefixes and suffixes) in their daily handwriting and spelling lessons.</p> <p>There's lots more to revise which we will cover in the afternoons and can also be found in the children's SATs packs.</p>

		<p>This term, learners will become engineers as we explore what it means to design, make and evaluate a product.</p> <p>We will look specifically at a type of 'moving mechanism' known as a cam.</p> <p>We will use our new skills and knowledge to design moving toys, based on our current text: Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone.</p>

	<p>In Term 3, readers will return to answering inference-style questions. Questions will challenge readers to unpick what the author is trying to say and to further understand what characters are thinking and feeling. In addition, we will be developing our oracy skills through Book Talk lessons.</p>	<p>In Term 4, Year 6 will use their indoor PE slot to learn Handball! This is a new game for SSJS - we can't wait to learn with the children.</p> <p>Outside, children will hone their hockey skills and focus on elements such as their stance, grip, dribbling and more. Towards the end of the term they will take part in house mini-matches.</p>
