Who are the 'change-makers' who have stood up for their rights?

Trying new skills

We will use our skills as Historians to understand more about Viking chronology (time lines and how long they were here for), what caused them to be successful and comparing them to other successful societies in history (such as the Ancient Greeks).

We will be thinking about how problems in society lead to new laws and rules being made – but what are the issues in Kingswood? What affects local residents and who can be responsible for making a change?

We will use our oracy skills to practice debate and persuasion.

Practising and planning

What makes a good campaign video?

We will use the persuasive techniques we used in our oracy lessons to practise making campaign videos which encourage people to make change.

How do we find out what our community wants? We will conduct school surveys to find out what is important to children in our school.

The Challenge
