Alongside this enquiry, we will be exploring Global Goal 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth and Global Goal 10 - Reducing Inequalities. We will be considering what it means to have good working conditions, what causes economic growth and the impact this has and the importance of equality in the workplace and beyond!</p>	<div style="text-align: center;"> </div> <p>The first book we will be exploring in Year 6 is Cogheart. During our reading lessons, we will be exploring the theme of friendship to analyse the story and to dig deeper into the authorial messages that have been included in the book. Through a mix of fluency lessons, extended reads and close reads, we will be fully immersing ourselves into the world of mechanicals and airships.</p>	<p>The first few weeks are all about place value. We will develop our understanding of place value by reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers up to 10,000,000. We will also be able to round these numbers and solve problems using these numbers. We will also learn how to work with negative numbers.</p> <p>As we move through the term, we will then focus on the four operations; addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and explore using all four of these operations in a variety of different problem solving scenarios.</p>

<div style="text-align: center;"> </div> <p>To start the term, we will be looking at the amazing picture book, Journey. The story allows us to use our imagination to decide on the story as it unfolds, as the book itself has no words. During our writing sequence, we will be revisiting fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases to engage our readers when writing our own narratives.</p>	<p>After our journey writing sequence, Year 6 will be using their knowledge of our class book Cogheart to assist us with our writing. We will be looking at a range of different skills, such as complex sentences, relative clauses and direct speech within our writing. Using these skills, we will be writing a persuasive advert and a narrative.</p>	<p>In Term 1, we will be improving our ability within gymnastics by developing our balance and upper body strength through handstands. From here, we will be increasing our ability to perform cartwheels, which will then allow us to build a sequence of movements. In netball, we will also develop our agility, passing ability, footwork and tactics for attacking and defending in netball. Finally, we will apply our learning to games of High Five Netball.</p>
